The Black Diamond Historical Society invites you to the
BDHS Children Summer Fun Program:



“What's Coal?: Where does it come from?”

*Every Thursday in July & August from 10am to 11am at the
Black Diamond Depot Museum ~ 32627 Railroad Ave. The program is free.*

Activities Include:

1. Visit the original 1910 Jail
2. Get a Boarding Pass and the conductor will announce "All A-Board". Children can climb to the Copula (with adult supervision) and view all of Railroad Ave from high above.
3. See the progress of the Locomotive (from outside the protective fencing) for which so many children participated in the contest.
4. A blast with the detonator---hands on.
5. A show of the mine model and how it works, created by Charles Corlett.
6. View a miner's lamp, lunch box, and other tools of the trade. Some hands on. View resident "Hard Hat Harry".
7. Step into a 1950s phone booth and dial the phone. (Sorry it does not ring anymore)
8. A small pre-packaged lump of 'nut coal' will be given to each child, courtesy of Palmer Coking Coal Co. and the BDHS.
